LFP FELLOWS PROGRAM

The Leadership Fellows program is for selected students with demonstrated leadership ability and is designed to advance and support students' understanding and demonstration of servant leadership within the Eastern community and the global community at large. The program aims to prepare students for purposeful cultural integration as productive innovators and leaders; encouraging them to addresses current societal problems through thoughtful faith-based service and influence the world through a commitment to Christian leadership and behavioral integrity.

LFP FELLOWS GRANT

Leadership grant is a \$1,000 a year grant given by the Leadership Fellows Program in partnership with Eastern University admissions which recognizes students for their outstanding leadership, Christian service, and scholastic achievement (minimum 3.4 GPA). Receiving this grant also gives students an open innovation to apply for the Leadership Fellows Program.

FELLOWS PROGRAM & SCHOLARSHIP

Leadership Fellowship is an award given to first-year students based on their outstanding **potential** for leadership, Christian service and scholastic achievement. A comprehensive online application exists for this program. Students interested in this Fellowship will be notified by EU undergraduate admissions that they are eligible to apply (*students not invited may ask for a special exception to apply*). Students who are awarded membership in the leadership program are also awarded an additional \$1,000 scholarship. This scholarship and membership are renewable dependent upon maintaining the minimum CGPA of 3.0 after the first year, 3.1 the second year, and 3.2 each succeeding year, as well as the additional scholastic and behavioral requirements within the program.

Through dedicated classroom learning, practical hands-on leadership experience, and intentional mentoring, students learn how to:

Inspire others in their pursuit of the common good as living models of Christ-centered leadership
Lead a major campus organization
Understand and discern effective uses of strategic leadership methods
Effectively lead and share vision in an organization
Identify their leadership strengths and styles
Strengthen their effectiveness as leaders
Understand leadership from a biblical perspective
Practice spiritual disciplines and personal character development
Lead with behavioral integrity
